NOTICE OF PRIVACY PRACTICES

THIS NOTICE DESCRIBES HOW MEDICAL INFORMATION ABOUT YOU MAY BE USED AND DISCLOSED AND HOW YOU CAN GET ACCESS TO THIS INFORMATION.

NOTHING IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN ENSURING YOUR PRIVACY

At SMC (Sylmar Medical Center), we understand your privacy is vitally important. As your medical provider, we are very proactive in safeguarding your information. We understand that with each office visit, you are placing your trust in us. And we will do everything we possibly can to ensure this trust is not breached. This booklet was developed to provide you with information regarding your rights to privacy and confidentiality. It contains our policies regarding privacy according to Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) rules and regulations. We encourage you to read this information so that you are fully informed and comfortable with the manner in which we treat your privacy. We welcome any questions you may have regarding this information.

EFFECTIVE DATE & CHANGES TO NOTICE

This Notice is dated April 14, 2003. SMC reserves the right change the terms of this Notice at any time. We reserve the right to make the new Notice provisions effective for all health information we currently maintain, as well as any health information we receive in the future. If we make material or important changes to our privacy practices, we will promptly revise our Notice. We will provide you a copy of the current Notice in each facility. Each version of the Notice will have an effective date listed on the first page.

ABOUT US

In this Notice we use terms like "SMC", "we", "us" or "our" to refer to Sylmar Medical Center, Its physicians, employees, staff and other personnel. All of the sites and locations of Progressive Medical Center follow the terms of this Notice and may share health information with each other for treatment, payment or health care operations purposes as described in this Notice.

PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE

This Notice describes how we may use and disclose your health information to carry out treatment, payment or health care operations and for other purposes that are permitted or required by law. This notice also outlines our legal duties for protecting the privacy of your health information and explains your rights to have your health information protected. We will create a record of the services we provide you, and this record will include your health information. We need to maintain this information to ensure that you receive quality care and to meet certain legal requirements related to providing you care.

OUR RESPONSIBILITIES

We are required by law to maintain the privacy of your health information and provide you notice of our legal duties and privacy practices with respect to you health information. We will abide by the terms of this Notice.

HOW WE MAY USE OR DISCLOSE YOUR HEALTH INFORMATION

The following categories describe examples of the way we use and disclose health information.

For Treatment: We may use your health information to provide you with medical treatment or services. For example, your health information will be disclosed to the physician nurses who participate in you care. We may disclose your health information to another physician for the purpose of a consultation. We may also disclose your health information to another healthcare provider to be sure those parties have all the information necessary to diagnose and treat you.

For Payment: We may use and disclose your health information to others so they will pay us or

reimburse you for your treatment. For example, a bill may be sent to you, your insurance cd name or a third-party payer. The bill may contain information that identifies you, your diagnosis, and treatment or supplies used in the course of treatment.

For Health Care Operations: We may use or disclose information to notify or assist in notifying a family member, personal representative, or another person responsible for your care, your location and general condition.

We may ask you to sign your name and date of birth at the registration desk and we may call your name in the waiting room when we call you for your appointment.

We may disclose your health information to a third party that performs services, such as billing and collection, on our behalf. In these cases, we will enter into a written agreement with the third party to ensure they protect the privacy of your health information.

<u>Notifications</u>: We may use or disclose information to notify or assist in notifying a family member, personal representative, or another person responsible for your care, your location, and general condition.

<u>Phone Calls and Letters</u>: We may use your health information when we contact you by phone or mail to inform you that your physician needs to see you at the office, or returning your call for any message that you left.

Individuals involved in your care or payment for your care: We may release your health information, including information about your condition, to a family member or friend who is involved in your medical care or who helps pay for your care. If you would like us to refrain from releasing your health information to a family member or friend, please notify our receptionists at any location. We may also disclose your health information to disaster-relief organizations so that your family can be notified about your condition, status and location.

We are also allowed by law to use and disclose your health information without your authorization for the following purposes:

As required by law: We may use and disclose your health information when required to do so by federal state or local law.

<u>Judicial and Administrative Proceedings</u>: If you are involved in a legal proceeding, we may disclose your health information in response to a court or administrative order. We may also release your health information in response to a subpoena, discovery request, or other lawful process by someone else involved in the dispute, but only if efforts have been made to tell you about the request or to obtain an order protecting the information requested.

<u>Health Oversight Activities</u>: We may use and disclose your health information to health oversight agencies for activities authorized by law. These oversight activities are necessary for the government to monitor the health care system, government benefit programs, compliance with government regulatory programs, and compliance with civil rights laws.

<u>Law Enforcement</u>: We may disclose your health information, within limitations, to law enforcement officials for several different purposes:

To comply with a court order, warrant, subpoena, summons, or other similar process;

To identify or locate a suspect, fugitive, material witness, or missing person;

About the victim of a crime, if unable to obtain the victim's agreement;

About a death we suspect may have resulted from criminal conduct;

About criminal conduct we believe in good faith to have occurred on our premises; and To report a crime, in an emergency situation.

<u>Public Health Activities</u>: We may use and disclose your health information for public health activities, including the following:

To prevent or control disease, injury or disability;

To report births or deaths;

To report child abuse or neglect;

To report adverse events, product defects or problems;

To track FDA-regulated products;

To notify people and enable product recalls; and

To notify a person who may have been exposed to a communicable disease or may be at risk for contracting or spreading a disease or condition.

<u>Serious Threat to Health or Safety</u>: If there is a serious threat to your health and safety or the health and safety of the public or another person, we may use and disclose your health information to someone able to help prevent the threat.

Coroners, Medical Examiners, and Funeral Directors: We may use and disclose health information to a coroner or medical examiner. This disclosure may be necessary to identify a deceased person or

determine the cause of death. We may also disclose health information, as necessary, to funeral directors to assist them in performing their duties.

<u>Workers' Compensation</u>: We may disclose your health information for workers' compensation or similar programs. These programs provide benefits for work-related injuries or illness.

<u>Victims of Abuse, Neglect, or Domestic Violence</u>: We may disclose health information to the appropriate government authority if we believe a patient has been the victim of abuse, neglect, or domestic violence. We will only make this disclosure if you agree, or when required or authorized by law.

Military and Veterans Activities: If you are a member of the Armed Forces, we may disclose your health information to military command authorities. Health information about foreign military personnel may be disclosed to foreign military authorities.

National Security and Intelligence Activities: We may disclose your health information to authorized federal officials for intelligence, counterintelligence, and other national security activities authorized by law.

<u>Protective Services for the President and Others:</u> We may disclose your health information to authorized federal officials so they may provide protective services for the President and others, including foreign heads of state.

<u>Inmates</u>: If you are an inmate of a correctional institution or under the custody of a law enforcement official, we may disclose your health information to the correctional institution or law enforcement official, we may disclose your health information to the correctional institution or law enforcement official to assist them in providing you health care, protecting your health and safety or the health and safety of others, or for the safety of the correctional institution.

<u>Research</u>: We may use and disclose your health information for certain limited research purposes. All research projects, however, are subject to a special approval process. This process evaluates a proposed research project, assesses a number of specific issues, and determines that appropriate privacy safeguards are in place to allow the use of health information in the research project. We may, however, disclose your health information to people preparing to conduct a research project; for example, to help them look for patients with specific medical needs, so long as the health information they review does not leave the practice.

Other Uses and Disclosures of Your Health Information: Other uses and disclosures of your health information not covered by this Notice or the laws that apply to us will be made only with your authorization. If you authorize us to use or disclose your health information, you may revoke that authorization, in writing, at any time. If you revoke your authorization, w will no longer use or disclose your health information as specified by the revoked authorization, except to the extent that we have taken action in reliance on our authorization.

YOUR RIGHTS REGARDING YOUR HEALTH INFORMATION

You have the following rights regarding health information we maintain about you:

<u>Right to Request Restrictions</u>: You have the right to request restrictions on how we use and disclose your health information for treatment, payment or health care operations. We are not required to agree to your request. If we do agree, we will comply with your request unless the information is needed to provide your emergency treatment. To request restrictions, you must make your request in writing and submit it to our main office in Bensenville.

<u>Right to Request Confidential Communications</u>: You have the right to request that we communicate with you in a certain manner or at a certain location regarding the services you receive from us. For example, you may ask that we only contact you at work or only by mail. To request confidential communications, you must make your request in writing and submit it to our office.

We will not ask you the reason for your request. We will attempt to accommodate all reasonable requests.

Right to Inspect and Copy: You have the right to inspect and copy health information that may be used to make decisions about your care. Usually, this includes medical and billing records, but does not include psychotherapy notes or information that is complied in reasonable anticipation of, or use in, a civil, criminal, or administrative action or proceeding. To inspect and copy your health information, you must make your request in writing by filling out the appropriate form provided by us and submitting it to our office. If you request a copy of your health information, we may charge a fee for the costs of copying, mailing or preparing the requested documents.

We may deny your request to inspect and copy in certain very limited circumstances. If you are denied access to your health information, you may request that the denial be reviewed by a licensed health care professional chosen by us. The person conducting the review will not be the person who denied your request. We will comply with the outcome of the review.

Right to Accounting of Disclosures: You have the right to request an accounting of certain disclosures

we make of your health information. Please note that certain disclosures, such as those made for treatment, payment or health care operations, need not be included in the accounting we provide to you.

To request an accounting of disclosures you must make your request in writing and submitting it to our main office in Bensenville. Your request must state a time period which may not be longer than six years, and which may not include dates before April 14, 2003. The first accounting you request within a 12-month period will be free. For additional accountings, we may charge you for the costs of providing the accounting. We will notify you of the costs involved and give you an opportunity to withdraw or modify your request before any costs have been incurred.

Right to a Paper Copy of This Notice: You have the right to a paper copy of this Notice at any time, even if you previously received it. To obtain a paper copy of this Notice, please contact our offices at any location.

Right to Complain: If you have any questions about this Notice or would like to file a complaint about our privacy practices, please direct your inquiries to our main office in 14124 Foothill Blvd., Suite 100 Sylmar, CA 91342. You will not be retallated against or penalized for filing a complaint.
